## STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

COOL was established by deed of trust on 9th March 2001 and the organisation is recognised as a charity by HM Revenue & Customs. On 20th November 2012, COOL was recognised by the Office of the Scottish Charity Regulator (OSCR) as incorporated as a Scottish Charitable Incorporated Organisation (SCIO). The charity name and Scottish charity number remain unchanged. The trustees are appointed on invitation by the existing trustees or members as required. A copy of the Constitution for COOL for the SCIO is available upon request. The AGM of the Trustees is held annually in January, February or March.

Management of the organisation is delegated by the trustees to the Management Committee currently comprising of ten people, including a representative of SU Scotland. Management Committee Members are appointed by invitation from the Trustees, as per the constitution. Management committee meetings are held five or six times per year, at reasonably regular intervals. The Management Committee reviews progress and agrees areas of development. It is also responsible for fund raising and financial management. There are also two sub-committees generally consisting of Management Committee members, one to cover finances and one for report writing, production and distribution.



The Youth Worker undertakes day to day activities of the project. Staff supervision is divided as follows:

- Monthly staff supervision/ management meetings are held between the Chairperson and the Youth Worker, as far as practical.
- Line Management support is also provided on a contract basis by the Scripture Union Scotland. The contract includes access to advice and staff support; staff training & development; and participation in joint meetings with other staff working in a similar environment. Colin Carmichael, the SU Scotland North Highlands, Western Isles & Orkney Regional Worker, is a member of the Management Committee, attending meetings as far as he can, and is available to the Youth Worker for help and advice.



Reporting arrangements within the organisation have been established as follows:

- The Youth Worker provides a written report to the Management Committee for discussion/information at the meetings.
- The finance sub-committee provides financial reports to the Management Committee in relation to income and expenditure.
- Objectives and forward plans are discussed at the Youth Worker's annual review, with evaluation of these plans taking place regularly with the Youth Worker, Chair and members of the Management Committee.

## **OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES**

### *PURPOSE OF THE TRUST*

'The work of the Charity focuses on the young people of Lochalsh, South Skye and Strathcarron. Its purpose is to benefit these young people through supporting and facilitating existing Christian youth work, and through providing additional social, recreational and spiritual opportunities for them. The charity considers that these ends may best be promoted by the employment of a youth worker, and by other means which the trustees may consider appropriate.'

## CHAIRMAN'S REPORT

As the Chair of Trustees for COOL it is my duty and privilege to present the 2016 Chairman of the Trustees report. The Trustees would like to express our thankfulness to God for His faithfulness and for providing the wide number of volunteers and supporters of COOL, without which COOL could not function.

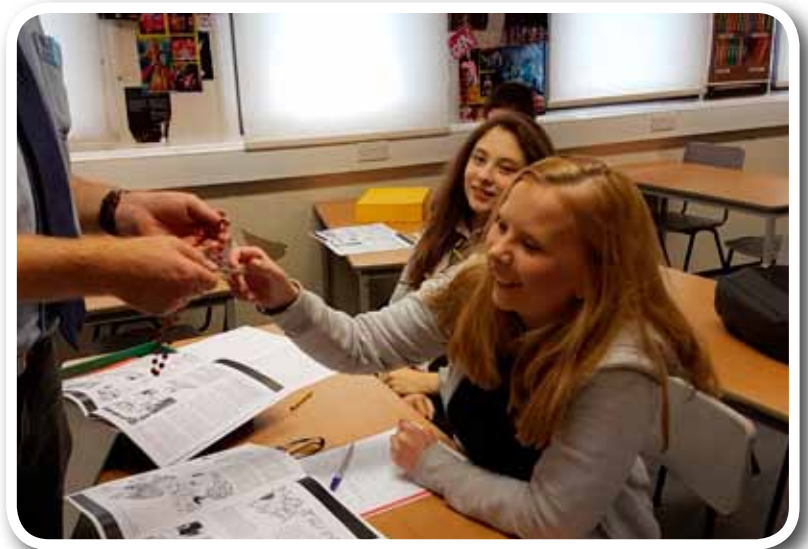
COOL has now enjoyed fifteen years' service from Dave as its Schools and Youth Worker. As a member of the Scripture Union Scotland (SUS) Associate Worker Scheme, COOL continues to be unique in having the longest serving worker of any such Trust. This has benefited the ongoing relationships that Dave has been able to develop with voluntary youth workers within the various churches, leaders in the churches and the students in the school. Through Dave's employment over the years, we continue to see some of the principle objectives of the trust being achieved.

The Trustees believe that there continues to be a beneficial difference in the spiritual atmosphere and awareness in Plockton High School and a positive benefit in the feeder primary schools. The spirit of tolerance and respect for those with a known Christian faith, other faith, or none has been maintained, and the larger number of pupils who claim to have a Christian faith. This is evidenced by the good numbers of high school age pupils attending the various youth groups run by

the churches in the COOL catchment area, and the numbers attending the meeting which Dave has hosted in his own home on Friday evenings. We are most grateful to Dave, Ruth and the family for hosting these evenings.

Over the years a greater unity among the churches has developed, especially working together in youth projects, wherever this has been possible. Naturally we continue to pray and strive for even more in this respect, despite some of the present challenges seen in today's society, which continues to affect some of the congregations in the area.

Dave continues to be available to inspire and advise voluntary youth leaders in



their youth leadership roles within their own congregations or areas, by offering training, practical advice and help.

The enhancement in Religious Observance (RO) in the local schools continues to be maintained. All local primary schools have regular RO events, supported by COOL and local church leaders enabling

them to comply with Scottish government requirements in this respect.

The church ministers and the Youth Worker are able to offer Plockton High School an ongoing chaplaincy team, helping to develop the spiritual and social confidence of the students, who are encouraged to assess their own belief system, inclusive of all. For the senior students there has still been opportunity to offer a S6 'Big Questions' day in the autumn of each year, to reflect on the relevance of the Christian heritage of Scotland, to evaluate the significance of this in their own lives and present day society. Dave has also been invited to regularly drop into the Higher RMPS class, which has opened doors and helped build relationships with students.



I wish to thank the Rector of Plockton High School, Mrs. Susan Galloway, on behalf of the Trustees and Management Committee members of COOL, for the continued good and positive relationship with the school which has been maintained in the past year. I also wish to thank the head teachers of the feeder primary schools and the many members

of the staff at all the various schools, for the welcome given to Dave on his regular visits.

As COOL has a totally inclusive ethos, its activities and meetings are open to all young people of the area regardless of any or no church connections. Many of the head teachers and staff in the schools continue to express their appreciation for Dave's input, sensitivity and professionalism, as well as pastoral help and support he is able to offer to students facing many issues which have become more prevalent in youth culture today. There are many difficult issues facing our young people and although it is a privilege for Dave to be in this pastoral role, it is sometimes difficult and comes with a high personal involvement which

can be a heavy burden to carry. Please do continue to pray for Dave in this role.

The Trustees remain very grateful to everybody who has made, and continues to make, this Christian youth worker project possible in the area.

Naturally, as Christians,

our greatest appreciation and thanks go to God, who has inspired so many people to provide financially and pray for the work, and provided people to work alongside and in cooperation with Dave, in their capacity as voluntary youth workers.

The Trustees are equally thankful to God for all those who serve COOL in an

administrative capacity, without whom COOL would not be able to operate, nor would Dave be able to do his work. It is an encouragement to all of us seeing young people responding to the presentations given to them by Dave, along with many others, from both the local area and further afield. I wish to thank all of those who pray for the Management Committee and Trustees.



We once again record our thanks to Mr Bob Anderson for his willingness to continue to be the independent examiner of the COOL financial accounts for another year, even though he and his wife have moved away from the area.

The financial viability of COOL has been maintained in the current year, as the majority of financial pledges made by so many to support COOL on a regular basis, have been maintained. The Trustees wish to thank everybody in their continuing support of COOL in this way. We are aware that one or two of our faithful supporters have passed away in the past

year, and offer our sympathy to their families. COOL has been very grateful for their regular giving and prayers over the years. We are also thankful for those congregations that support COOL financially on a regular basis, as well as the Open Door Café for their on-going financial contributions. We are particularly grateful to the family of the late Alison Angus, one of our first Trustees, who made a donation to COOL in her name.

Away from the schools, there is always the need for more adults to offer their time, energy and expertise to assist and lead young people's work locally. There are areas of work which may be forced to stop if new volunteers are not forthcoming. The voluntary youth workers and helpers in the different areas are often very busy and overstretched, and when there is no additional help some things are not achievable. Dave is always willing to continue to offer advice and help train any who wish to volunteer.

Dave has set up a local support team who he meets with on a monthly basis whenever possible, to discuss and pray about the work, both in times of encouragement, some discouragements, and the challenges Dave faces. Thanks again to Dave for his ongoing, energetic work and to Ruth for her continued support. Dave appreciates the opportunities to meet regularly with some of the local church ministers for times of discussion, prayer and fellowship, as they seek to work for the Gospel in our catchment area.

As a member of the SU Scotland Associate Worker Scheme, COOL values the support and expertise offered in different aspects of the work, particularly from Colin Carmichael. The Trustees thank him for the commitment, expertise and energy that he offers and his willingness to help and advise.



#### *PERSONNEL*

The Trustees wish to record their grateful thanks to all who serve COOL on the Management Committee and the Finance Sub-Committee. Without their faithful and dedicated hard work COOL would not be able to function. We thank God for His provision of these dedicated people.

The Trustees were delighted when Frances Westerduin agreed to join us as a Trustee and we look forward to her energy, direction and discernment in this role. We wish her God's blessing as she takes up her responsibilities.

## MANAGEMENT COMMITTEE REPORT



We are pleased and grateful to report that COOL has continued to run smoothly, doing all the things we have been doing so successfully for so many years. This reflects the fact that people have continued to support us prayerfully, financially and with their time alongside the fact that our full time youth worker, Dave, has lost none of his creativity, vision and enthusiasm.

All eleven of the local primary schools have continued to welcome Dave in to give assemblies and ease the transition to High School for the P7s. The 'It's Your Move' booklets were widely distributed once again before the end of the summer term.

Dave continues to offer pastoral support at Plockton High School, running a drop in club open to all and encouraging the young people who want to pray or look at the Bible. He has been asked to lead

assemblies and organises the annual S6 Big Questions day. Dave has been in the area so long now that many of the students have known him since they were in the early stages of primary school and this has a real benefit in their willingness to engage with him or share their concerns. All S6 leavers were once again offered the gift of a Bible due to the generosity of our supporters.

Outside of schools, the Friday evening youth fellowship has returned to Dave and Ruth's house and is continuing to thrive. Dave also supports youth work in Glenelg, Lochcarron and Kyleakin. Again, he is such a familiar and friendly face, young people tend to find him easy company and the youth leaders really welcome his input.





Peru trip, has gone on to study Spanish and was also able to act as the translator for this year's group.

Four S6 leavers chose to participate in the biannual work party to Peru this year alongside Dave and Heather Strong, and put a lot of effort into raising the necessary funds. Working with TearFund and a local Peruvian charity, Agape, the group helped with children's games, producing teaching resources, cleaning and painting as well as participating in a festive parade. Another blessing was having former Plockton pupil Sandy Deans return to give the address at this year's Annual Celebration.

While Dave was away in Peru and not able to participate in summer holiday clubs this year, he spent considerable time writing material and helping with the planning and preparation. The clubs followed a Wild West theme of 'Lost and Found.' They were, as ever, very well attended. Shortly after their return from Peru, Dave and Sarah Strang took a small group to the Christian festival "Soul Survivor".

## **FINANCIAL REVIEW**

This financial review covers the period 1st December 2015 to 30th November 2016.

The principal source of income remains regular pledged donations from local supporters, both individuals and church organisations. There have been slight drops in individual pledged donations both gift aided and non-gift aided of around 3%, but this has been offset by an increased monthly pledged donation from one of the local church partners. Other ad-hoc donations during the year gift aided, non-gift aided and church organisations were also down during the year, probably due the financial climate. However, we received a generous bequest which meant that we finished the financial year with an increased balance rather than the anticipated decrease to our reserve funds. We expect that monthly income

from regular donations will still cover the majority of the costs of the ongoing work of COOL in 2017.

As always, we are grateful for God's provision to us through the financial giving and prayerful support of His people during this past year.

## **RESERVES POLICY**

It is our policy to hold reserves of approximately six months expenditure including designated funds. At the end of the year COOL held unrestricted cash funds of £32,012 plus £986 of restricted funds, which have been designated for supporting young people going out to Peru to participate in work parties with Tearfund.

This should be a sufficient reserve to cover our anticipated expenditure for the coming year.

## *BASIS OF INDEPENDENT EXAMINER'S STATEMENT*


