How is our love for God?

Have you ever asked yourself the question, why did Jesus stay on Earth for 40 days before he ascended to be with His Father? He must have been longing to get back to His father, especially after everything that had happened, so why after His resurrection did he not just meet with His closest followers and ascend into heaven the same day. They would have seen he was alive, known that the Scriptures had been fulfilled and then waited for the Holy Spirit.


